It has worked out pretty well so far but prayers would be greatly appreciated that I would be able to stay awake for class.

During the first part of November, I was in a few more missions conferences in California including getting to be a part of Lancaster Baptist Church's missions conference. It was truly an honor to speak to the students of West Coast Baptist College and to the members of Lancaster Baptist Church. It was only a few years ago that I was one of the missions students at West Coast listening to the missionaries who come through and it felt slightly odd to realize that I was now that missionary. It has been a blessing these past two months to have met many young people that feel the Lord is calling them into missions. Some of them specifically believing the Lord is calling them to serve in Japan. It has been a highlight of deputation for me to be able to sit down, talk, and pray with some of these young ladies. I am so excited to see what the Lord will do through their lives and I am excited that people are still answering the Lord's call for laborers in the harvest.

The last two weeks of November I was in Montana where I was able to spend Thanksgiving with some friends from college and visit churches. Thank you to all of you who prayed that it would not snow while I was in Montana. I knew there was no way my car could make it through heavy snow and the only way I could make it through Montana was if it did not snow. God answered prayers and for the entire two weeks I was there it did not snow! Three hours after I left Montana it started snowing and snowed for the next 3 days. Thank you also for all of you that have been praying for my safety while traveling. I officially had the first blowout of deputation.


